
From the Mayor's Desk

After a public hearing on April 4th, the Village Board of Trustees adopted the budget for the 2023-2024 fiscal year. The Village Board conducted budget workshops through February and March leading up to the public hearing on April 4th. Each year the Board works with our department heads to build a budget that balances meeting the current needs of our community while also planning for the future. The 2023-2024 budget meets those goals while continuing to remain under the tax cap. The budget process is always open to the public, and we encourage residents to come out to gain an understanding of how

Summer at Bozenkill Park

Bozenkill Summer Camp Program for Kids: We are excited about our upcoming summer camp program! It will run for 5 one-week sessions from July 10 to August 11, weekdays from 8:30 a.m.-12 noon. Our Camp Director Jami Rubin and her staff will have special weekly activities including swimming, games, sports and arts & crafts. Camp is available for children ages 5-13 (children must have completed kindergarten); cost is \$75 per week. Registration forms are at the Village website and office. Bozenkill Park and Pool:

- Park will officially be open from May 27–October 8. Hours: 12 noon-7 p.m. weekdays and 10 a.m.–7 p.m. on weekends. Parking for Village residents is free (no pass required). Non-resident parking is \$10 per visit or \$50 for the season, available at the Park or the Village office.
- **Pool** season runs from Saturday, June 17–Sunday, August 27 and is open to all. Pool hours are 12 noon-7 p.m., except for Tuesdays and Thursdays June 20-August 10, when Water Aerobics classes start at 6 p.m.
- Swimming for residents will continue to be \$3 per person; children 5 and under and Village seniors 62+ are free. For non-residents, fees are \$5 per person; \$3 for children 5 and under, and \$3 for seniors 62+. Seasonal Swim Passes are \$40 per person; \$100 for a family of four (\$20 each additional family member). Swimming lessons will be offered starting July 3; cost is \$60 for residents and \$75 for non-residents for 5 private lessons age 3+.
- In addition to our pool, sports courts, trails and playground, we have two pavilions available for rental to the public. Visit the Village website at Park Rental Forms or contact the Village office for fees and reservation forms.
- Water Aerobics: Water aerobics will take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays June 20-August 10 from 6-7:00 p.m. Choose either Tuesday or Thursday for the 8 week session. The fee for residents is \$50 and \$60 for non-residents.

Archives and Museum

<u>Open Saturdays</u>: The Archives and Museum will have open hours one Saturday a month beginning in September 2023 from 9:00AM - 1:00PM. There is no need to make an appointment. Feel free to drop in and visit us! **Upcoming Saturdays are as follows:** September 16, October 14, November 18 and December 2. <u>Appointments Available</u>: The Archives are currently open by appointment. To use our collection for research purposes, please contact us through the Village of Altamont website.

<u>Photographs Wanted</u>: The Archives and Museum is always interested in any old photographs of the Village of Altamont, particularly of buildings, businesses, homes or public events. If you have any photographs that you think would be of interest, please let us know.

<u>American Legion Post 977</u>: The Village Archives and Museum is looking for information about American Legion Post 977. We are assisting with an upcoming project and are seeking any pictures, documents, news clippings or ephemera about the Altamont American Legion.

Village Code Reminders for Residents and Business Owners

Home Improvement Projects: Many common home projects require a building permit. Any new construction or renovation/repair inside or outside the home now requires a permit under the 2020 International Code Council (ICC). This includes the construction of decks, roofs, sheds, fences, replacement windows and the installation of a swimming pool. Before beginning any project, please check with our Building and Code Inspector Gary Goss by calling 518-861-8554 Ext. 17, or by e-mail: villagebuilding@altamontvillage.org

<u>Vehicles (Registered and Unregistered)</u>, <u>Campers, RVs & Trailers</u>: Automotive vehicles or trailers of any kind or type without current license plates shall not be parked or stored on any property other than in completely enclosed buildings. No trailer may be parked within the front or side yards at any time. However, one boat, utility or one travel trailer may be stored in the rear yard, only if it has a current license.

<u>Pedestrian Right of Way and Village Parks</u>: NYS Law requires vehicles to yield the right of way to pedestrians using crosswalks. Please use crosswalks when crossing our busy streets to stay safe and avoid injury. Village Parks have a carry in-carry out

policy for trash and a smoke-free policy. Please help create a clean and healthy environment for all.

Signs and Deliveries: Each business and organization is allowed to display one sandwich board style sign during their regular operating hours, by permit. The sign may be placed on the sidewalk where it does not impede pedestrian flow, sight line or create other hazards. Please remind delivery drivers to stop & unload only in designated parking areas.

Buying/Selling Property: If you are buying or selling a house in Altamont, be sure to have your attorney or real estate agent contact the Village office at 518-861-8554 to request a tax search that includes a final water/sewer reading, sump pump connection check and tax bill.

Department of Public Works

<u>Water Restrictions</u>: The Village restricts the use of water from May 15 to September 15 of each year. Hand held watering is permitted from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. daily. The use of lawn sprinklers and sprinkler systems are allowed during the hours of 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. using the odd/even house number system.

<u>Village Stormwater</u>: The Village stormwater program is dedicated to protecting our streams and creeks. Our streams and creeks are sources of drinking water and homes to many different species of aquatic life. Excess amounts of nutrients can harm these waterways, especially an abundance of Phosphorus and Nitrogen. These nutrients are found in products used for lawn care, detergents used for washing cars, and animal waste including pets, livestock and wildlife.

We ask our residents to take a few steps in helping reduce these levels of potentially dangerous nutrients:

- If using fertilizers for lawn or other plant care, use products with reduced or "0" Phosphorus.
- Take time to carefully read and follow application directions when applying lawn care products.
- Wash vehicles where soapy water will not go into storm drains. Try to use areas where soapy water is infiltrated into the soil.
- Do not put yard waste on or near catch basins or where rain runoff can carry the waste into catch basins.

Dog Strolling: When enjoying a stroll with your dog, please abide by the Village's pooper scooper law, and discard those baggies at home. There are pet waste disposal stations in Orsini, Schilling, and Bozenkill Parks for emergencies.

Fall Water Flushing: Begins October 5 from 8:30 a.m.-3 p.m. Monday-Friday. Have a safe and healthy Spring/Summer!

Altamont Police Department

Chief Jason Johnston and the members of the Altamont Police Department would like to warn Village residents about the recent increase in reports of attempted and successful scams across the country, the state and right here in Altamont. Victims of these types of crimes can be affected by them for years after they are committed. Recognizing common signs of a scam could help you avoid one.

Keep the following in mind:

- Take a pause. Scammers create a sense of urgency to prey on victims' emotions and their love for family members.
- Verify any supposed emergency by calling friends and family before sending money. This is especially important if a potential victim has been warned not to do so by the caller.
- If the caller purports to be a bail bondsperson, ask where the relative is being held and contact the facility directly.
- If the caller purports to be a law enforcement officer, get the exact agency name, hang up, and call that department directly.
- Be suspicious of anyone who calls unexpectedly asking to be sent money.
- Never send cash through the mail.
- Never purchase pre-paid debit cards or gift cards for the purpose of transferring money.
- Develop a secret code or "password" with family members that can be used to verify the identity of family members over the phone.
- Ask a question that only the real family member would know the answer to, such as "what was the name of your first pet?"
- Set Facebook and other social media settings to private to limit information available to scammers, such as the names of relatives. If you find yourself to be the victim of one of these scams report them to the police and to the Federal Trade Commission at https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/#/. Thank you and have safe and happy summer!
