S E W E R P L A N T P R O J E C T C O M P L E T E

The sewer plant project, mandated by the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and under construction since June 2012, is scheduled for completion in October 2013. The DEC has monitored the operation of Altamont's Wastewater treatment plant for many years, and mandated that improvements be made.

The improvement project will replace the aged plant with one that has new and modern equipment that meets DEC's discharge mandates, and one that meets the needs of the Village for many years. The cost of the project is \$ 3.5 million and financed by low

interest loans under the Clean Water State Revolving Fund.

All users of the Village sewer system will pay for the cost of the project spread over 30 years. The capital charge, beginning in the Fall of 2013, is estimated to be \$ 90 annually which means \$ 45 per current billing period, approximately 25 cents a day per sewer unit.

Although no one welcomes an increase in user fees, it is necessary because of the legal mandate from the DEC to remedy treatment deficiencies. To ignore the mandate would result in severe penalties, including possible closure of the

treatment facility and additional fines from DEC. The new plant will deliver efficient, dependable, and well-run water and sewage treatment critical to a community's quality of life.

The Altamont Board has discussed the project monthly for several years. It has been reported periodically in the local media.

C O N S T R U C T I O N U P D A T E**

NYS Department of Transportation has confirmed with Mayor James M. Gaughan that Altamont Blvd (Route 156) will be resurfaced this fall. The project is slated to begin on Monday, September 30th.

The resurfacing process will consist of removal and recycling of the concrete. Once this is completed, a final

layer of asphalt will be laid over the recycled materials.

The road will be open for local residents. Residents should expect delays and one lane traffic. To avoid the construction zone, the Village encourages residents to use Brindle Road, off of Main Street, as a connector between Route 146 and Route 156.

NEWS FROM ALTAMONT ARCHIVES AND MUSEUM

The summer season was a busy one for the volunteers in the Archives and Museum. Keith C. Lee, Connie Rue, Ron Ginsburg and others have been hard at work on the manuscript for the forthcoming book on the Village, scanning hundreds of vintage photographs and researching the history for each image. The book (scheduled to be published by Arcadia Press in the Spring 2014) is authored by Keith C. Lee and entitled: *Under the Helleberg: ALTAMONT, NY.* The timeframe of the seven chapters in the book begins with the coming of the earliest of settlers, the establishment of West Guilderland, which becomes Knowlersville, then Altamont, and continues to the period when "the

winds of war" are beginning to be felt in America, in the late 1930's.



STAR PROGRAM

All current homeowners must now register to receive the basic STAR property tax exemption in the year 2014 and thereafter. Senior Citizens receiving Enhanced STAR do not have to register.

Registration may be done online at www.tax.ny.gov or by telephone 518-457-2036. The registration deadline is December 31, 2013. New homeowners should file Form RP-425

FALL YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Yard waste collection will begin on Tuesday, October 15th and continue through Friday, November 29th. The Village will vacuum leaves on Tuesdays and Fridays, weather permitting. If using bags, the bags must be biodegradable, closed and sealed.

Brush and branches, no wider than 2" in diameter, must be bundled with twine, a maximum of 4 feet in length and must be able to be lifted to the truck by one person. These items will be picked up on Wednesdays.
