Wastewater Plant Project Near Completion

The wastewater project, mandated by the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and under construction since last June, is scheduled for completion in July 2013. The DEC has monitored the operation of Altamont's wastewater treatment plant for many years, as it has other municipalities which are in the Hudson River estuary and which potentially affect surrounding watersheds.

The improvement project will replace the aged plant with one that has new and modern equipment, meeting the updated State agency dis-

charge standards and mandates, and one that will meet the needs of the Village for many years. The cost of the project is \$3.5 million and financed by low interest loans for the project under the Clean Water State Revolving Fund.

All users of the Village sewage system will pay for the cost of the project spread over 20 years. The capital charge beginning in the fall of 2013, is estimated to be \$84 annually which would mean \$42 per current billing period, approximately 25 cents a day per household.

No one welcomes an increase in user fees no matter how small, but it is necessary because the Village was placed under a legal mandate from the DEC to remedy treatment deficiencies. To ignore their mandate would result in severe penalties, including possible closure of the treatment facility and additional fines from DEC. It is a small price to pay to have efficient, dependable, and well-run water and sewage treatment facilities critical to a community's quality of life.

Village Promotes Two Employees

The Board of Trustees appointed Jeffrey Moller as Altamont's Superintendent of Public Works and Larry Adams as Assistant Superintendent of Public Works at its April meeting. The recommendation comes as a result of a recruitment effort initiated by the Board in February and recommended to the Board by a committee comprised of Trustee Kerry Dineen, Village Clerk Patty Blackwood and Mayor James Gaughan.

Jeffrey Moller has worked for the Village of Altamont's Department of Public Works since 2000, and as Assistant Superintendent since 2002. In addition to managing the water, sewer, and street departments, Mr. Moller

will be responsible for the supervision of the department's line employees. He has extensive knowledge of municipal water and sewer systems, is proficient with scientific concepts and water quality standards, and has effectively overseen the operation and maintenance of the Village's equipment. He holds an Associate Degree in Business from Hudson Valley Community College. In the Committee's opinion, Jeff is highly qualified, has extensive experience, is appropriately certified, has demonstrated successful management skills, and is highly suited for the position of Superintendent of Public Works.

Larry Adams is a life long resident of Altamont and is the longest serving em-

ployee in the Public Works Department. Mr. Adams has overseen the day to day operation of the mechanics of the Village water system and will continue this responsibility in his new position. In recent months, Mr. Adams rose to the challenges as temporary Assistant Superintendent, exhibiting the skills and initiative necessary to the job. Mr. Adams long standing record of excellent work and dedication to the Village makes him qualified to take on the permanent position of Assistant Superintendent of Public Works.

We are confident that Mr. Moller and Mr. Adams will maintain the outstanding service Altamont's Public Works Department provides to the Village.

Hand held watering is permitted between the hours of 7am to 9am and 7pm to 9pm.

The use of lawn sprinklers and sprinkler systems are allowed

during the hours of 7am to 9 am and 7pm to 9pm using the odd/even house number system. Unnumbered houses/businesses use even days.

Fines - \$ 25.00 first offense
\$ 100.00 subsequent offense
